Frequently Asked Questions

- **What are the Resident course delivery hours?**
 - TDY Funding to /on/ from Fort Gregg-Adams, VA is from Parent Organization, not a centralized fund
 - Two weeks (10 Education Days): Monday to Friday, except Official Federal Holidays
 - Instructor led classes, 0800-1700 (EST)
 - Small Group work is required outside of instructor led class & over the weekend
 - Students arrive to Fort Gregg-Adams, VA at least 24hrs prior to Training Day One
 - **Students depart Fort Gregg-Adams (formerly Fort Lee), VA on Day Ten, no-earlier-than (NET) 1500hrs (EST)**
- **What are the Virtual course delivery hours?**
 - Four (4) weeks: Monday to Friday, except Federal Holidays
 - Instructor led classes, typically are 0800-1200 Eastern Standard Time (EST)
 - Small Group is required outside of instructor led classes
- **What do I need to take the JLC virtually?**
 - Microsoft Teams Access
 - Joint Knowledge Online Virtual Classroom Access
 - Web Camera
- **Will officers be able to participate in the virtual course and still execute their day job?**
 - Yes, however Students are required to have focused participation during instructor led classes
- **Does the JLC award Joint Credits?**
 - Yes, Commissioned Officers will receive, 1.5 Joint Credits; plus .5 Joint Credits upon compilation of Joint Humanitarian Operations Course (JHOC)
 - Self nomination is thru the Joint Policy Branch
- **JLC was validated thru the American Council on Education (ACE) for students to receive three (3) undergraduate college credits in Logistics Operations.**
- **Will the JLC be integrated in the JCW & JCCL sometime in the future?**
 - Yes, In development
- **Will the JLC be integrated with Advana sometime in the future?**
 - Yes, students use Advana during CAPSTONE Outbrief with COCOM J4

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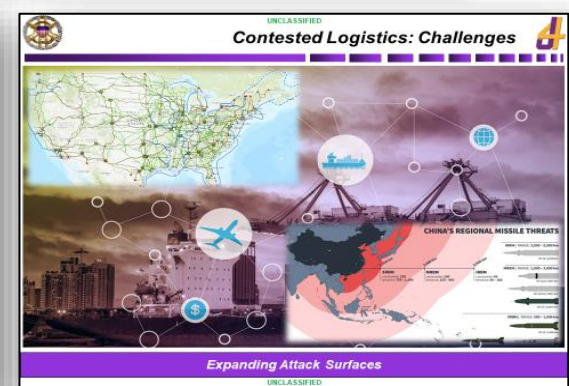
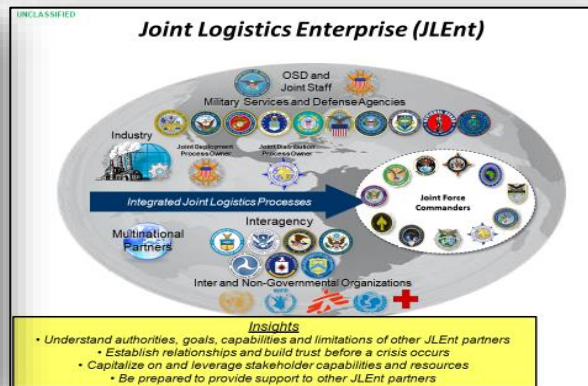
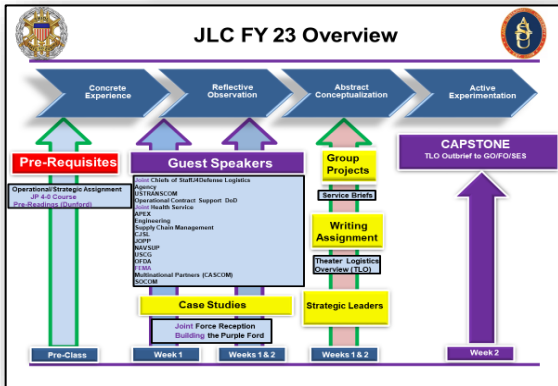

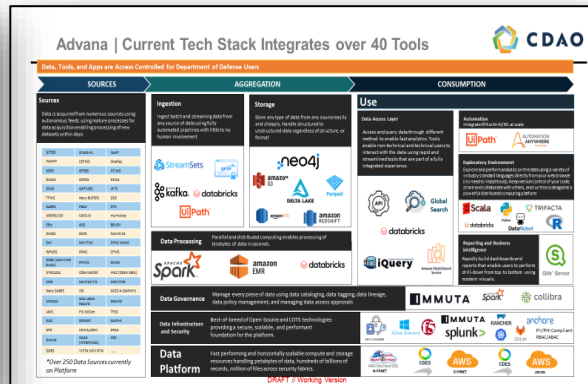
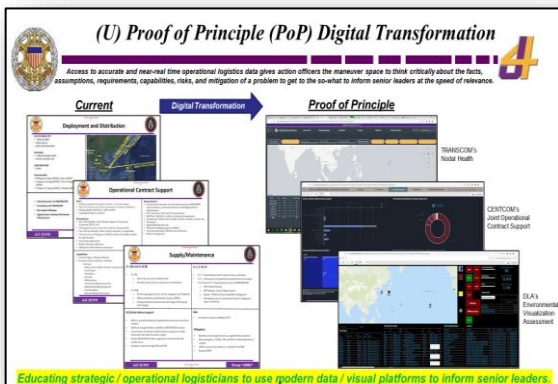


Mission
