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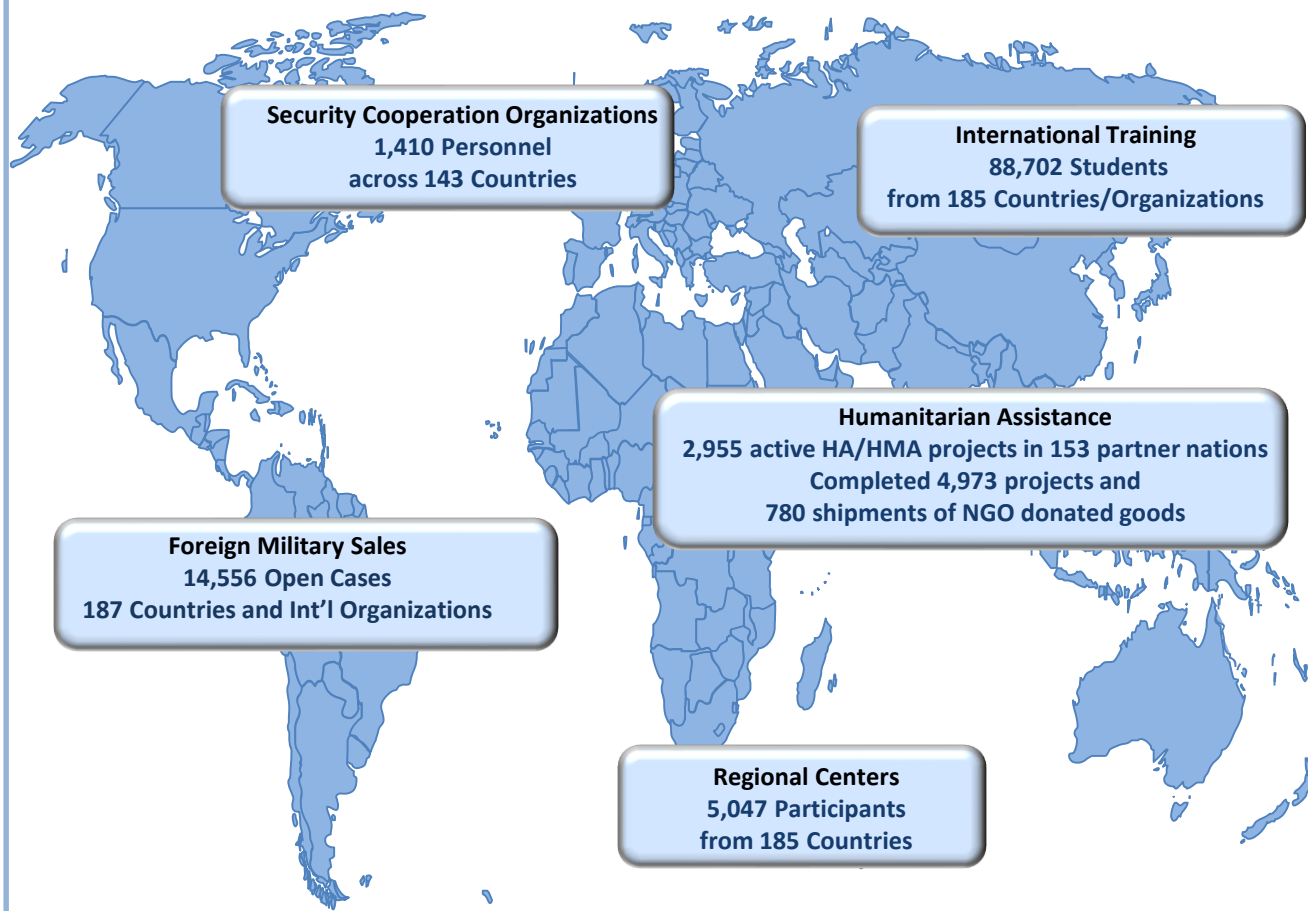

Identifying Space for Change

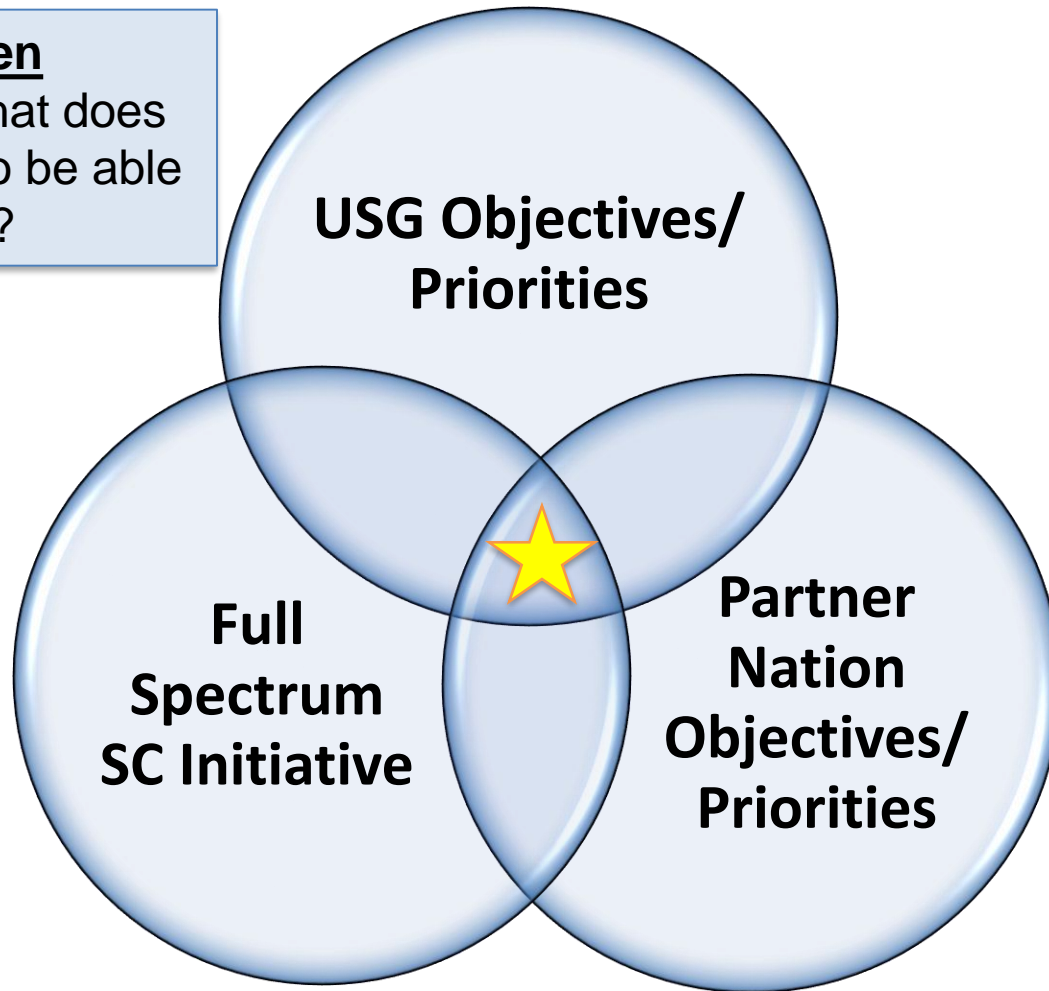
Problem-driven

approach: What does the PN need to be able to do and why?

U.S.

Feasibility:

How can ICB contribute to the needed capability?
Are the other elements present/being provided by other SC programs?



PN Feasibility:

- Does the PN share the USG's objective?
- How do they do things now (baseline)?
- From this starting point, what changes are feasible - and will result in the desired outcome(s)?



Full Spectrum ICB Tools



- **Logistics Development (LOGDEV)** – a suite of programs to improve multinational-coalition logistics capabilities through GCC-led activities
- **Vertically Integrated Logistics Approach (VILA)** – an approach to identify logistics gaps and recommend solutions
- **Logistics Interoperability Symposium (LIS)** – global and regional seminar(s) promoting dialog on logistics interoperability.
 - Recently executed 20-24 August 2018 in Oberammergau, Germany; 71 representatives from 36 Partner Nations; Focused on best practices, Security Cooperation Tools and Solutions
- **Ministry of Defense Advisor Program (MoDA)** – In resident DoD civilian employees advising on specific functional issues
- **Defense Institution Reform Initiative (DIRI)** – non-resident advisors advancing specific partner institutional reform goals
